



Grade 9: Course Outline 2013 - 2014

Introduction:

Media, as a subject and a course of study, is becoming increasingly relevant in today's world. It has a powerful ability to educate, inform and influence culture and society. As a result, the central focus of the Media Program at Macdonald High is to allow students to:

- apply appropriate strategies for constructing meaning
- follow a process to respond to media texts
- construct her/his own view of the world through the media
- follow a production process in order to communicate for specific purposes to a specified audience
- self-evaluate her/his development as a viewer and producer of media texts

In a series of units, using lectures, films, and assignments, students will be able to learn to use software that will allow them complete larger projects. The media projects in each term will allow students to showcase their skills to their fellow students. We will be working on the following items/programs:

- Projects using Power Point including: Media essays
- Digital Photography (Adobe Photoshop) including: Web publishing, Yearbook coverage, CD Jackets & Slideshow
- Introduction to Video production
- Media & Film Study

Program Rules

- A) Stand in front of the class awaiting your attention, or,
- B) I call for your attention
- When you notice or hear any of the 2 signals, you have to . . .
- **STOP** whatever you are doing
- **LOOK** at/for me.
- **LISTEN** for the instructions.

3. Asking a question...

- If you have a problem with the work, please follow these steps to help you get the most out of your class.
 - A) Ask the person next to you for help. If he/she cannot help you, then ask the person on your other side
 - B) If no one around you can help you, then raise your hand to ask me for help with the problem.
- I am always willing to help with any problems, but you must follow the above procedures.

4. Leaving the class ...

For certain Media projects, you will, from time to time, have to leave the class. Before you leave the room you MUST:

- Sign-out, or
- Have your agenda ready to be signed.

5. With about 5 minutes left to class ...

- Begin clean up by first taking care of the materials used in class and saving all necessary files.
- Gather items that you will need to take with you, and wait for my dismissal.

Student Expectations

- Be prompt and prepared: Be ready to learn when class begins.
- Be productive: Turn in work on time, and always do your best. Assignment deadlines will no longer be the end of term. Assignments handed past their deadlines will receive a 15% deduction.
- Be a polite and positive participant: *Speak in a normal tone of voice, and listen attentively.*
- Be a problem solver: Correct problems quickly and peacefully before they escalate.
